The team has a \$17,000,000 club option with a \$500,000 buyout for 2022 and an \$18,000,000 club option with a \$500,000 buyout for 2023.) Martínez receives an assignment bonus of \$500,000 if traded during the 2017 or 2018 season and \$1,000,000 if traded after 2018 season.

⁷Miller started 2016 with 3.030 years of service time. He added 136 days of service time while starting ten games at Visalia and Reno.

⁸6-year, \$83,000,000 deal. Myers received a \$15,000,000 signing bonus, and he will receive \$2,000,000 in 2017; \$2,000,000 in 2018; \$3,000,000 in 2019; \$20,000,000 in 2020; \$20,000,000 in 2021; and \$20,000,000 in 2022. The Padres have a \$20,000,000 club option with a \$1,000,000 buyout for 2023.
