- BAY STATE "BLUE" LAWS AND BIMBA. By William Wolkovich. An account of the trial of communist Anthony Bimba in Brockton, Massachusetts in 1926 for two counts of blasphemy and sedition. Both counts have an element of freedom of speech which makes the trial, and this book, relevant today. Brockton, Massachusetts: Forum Press. 1973. Pp. 141. \$5.95.
- BEYOND THE INTERESTS OF THE CHILD. By Joseph Goldstein, Anna Freund, and Albert J. Solnit. This book is a critical study of the existing laws governing the disposal of children and presents an attempt to formulate a revised code. New York: The Free Press. 1973. Pp. xiv, 170. Paper, \$1.95.
