### ANNOUNCEMENT

The Second National Conference of Law Reviews will be held at the Notre Dame College of Law on February 14, 15 and 16, 1952. For the sake of continuity and because the three themes stressed at the first conference two years ago at Northwestern are sufficiently broad, they will remain the themes for the second conference. The three are: whether legal publications can be improved so as to greater enhance their use as an aid to education; second, can law reviews better perform their function as "molders" of the law; and finally, whether they can make a greater contribution to the practising lawyer.

Prominent jurists, teachers and practitioners have been invited to present their views at the convention and the seminar method so effectively employed at the first conference will be used. Valuable reports will be submitted by committees which were formed at the last convention.
