The award was presented by St. Thomas School of Law Dean Daniel Kelly, a former faculty member at Notre Dame Law School, who became the dean at St. Thomas earlier this year.

On the evening of October 3, at the Basilica of St. Mary in Minneapolis, Cole delivered a lecture with Rob Vischer, president of the University of St. Thomas. The talk was part of the new interdisciplinary lecture series Hope and Healing, which focuses on current social and faith issues in America through the lens of Catholic Social Teaching. Cole and Vischer spoke about the power and importance of faith- and values-based education.

The series is held in honor and memory of Reverend David T. Link, former dean of Notre Dame Law School and founding dean of the University of St. Thomas School of Law.
