Information Technology

On **Wednesday, January 9th**, at 8:00 p.m., the Office of Information Technologies will

reset the network registration information for all wired computers on campus. To minimize a potential network interruption, we recommend you take the following actions:

- Turn off your office computer when leaving for the day on Wednesday, January 9th.
- On Thursday, January 10th, if after turning on your computer you are unable to access your email or other services over the network, reboot the computer which should complete the registration process. If you still cannot access your email or other services, then open a browser and visit any website. You will be redirected to the ND Network Registration webpage where you can enter your NetID and password to register your computer on the network.

During this process, some users may see a message stating that a security certificate is not valid, or that information about the certificate is not available. In this case, it is safe to choose “Yes” or “OK” to complete the registration process.
