ND Law to hold second annual Religious Liberty Summit in Rome, Italy

The world's leading defenders of religious freedom will gather in Rome from July 20-22 for the second annual Notre Dame Religious Liberty Summit, hosted by the Law School's Religious Liberty Initiative. Read more here.



On June 21, the Supreme Court ruled in *Carson v. Makin* that states may not exclude religious schools from private-school-choice programs. The Religious Liberty Initiative filed two briefs on behalf of Jewish, Muslim, and Catholic schools to defend this important freedom for faith-based education.
