

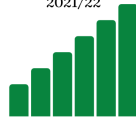

NDLS students can access the New York Times website courtesy of the Kresge Law Library. Follow these steps in order to register:

- Use a wired computer in the computer lab or access the Eduroam wireless network. Do not use a VPN.
- Visit AccessNYT.com.
- Select University of Notre Dame Law School.
- Create an account using your Notre Dame email address.

Once your account is created, you can access it through the regular New York Times website rather than AccessNYT.com. If you already have a subscription, you will need to cancel it before registering via the law library's access. RESTAURANT REVIEW: Dainty Maid Food Hall

How I Drowned my ND Football Sorrows in Breakfast Ramen



Clearly I am not a photographer, but this is what I ate.

After a brief hiatus, I'm back with a review of a place I have been dying to try: The Dainty Maid Food Hall. This place is typically open for breakfast and lunch, but they frequently host "pop-up" dinners, so keep an eye on their [Instagram](#) and [Facebook](#) pages.

Located in the historic Dainty Maid building in downtown SB, the Food Hall was designed to give chefs and small business owners the opportunity to test out new restaurant concepts and ideas before eventually moving into their own spaces. ([See a video of the](#)

venue here.) I love this format because the restaurants get to be more creative about the dishes they offer.

The Food Hall is currently home to Hall Pass (craft cocktail bar), A Roaster Called Revenant (coffee shop), Pink Lemonade Pastries (duh), The Beard & The Boss, and the Breakfast Club (restaurants with a globally-inspired feel). You place your order from any of their menus using one, easy online ordering platform, and when your food is ready someone runs it to you (no small talk needed, which this introvert was very happy about).

I ordered the Breakfast Ramen and Latkes from The Breakfast Club, which turned out to be an unexpected but delicious combo. The ramen checked all the boxes ramen should check: a ton of pork belly and a crispy pork dumpling, fresh veggies, and super flavorful broth. And, while it's pretty hard to mess up a fried potato, the sour cream, honey crisp apple and chive hollandaise really dressed up the latkes.

Definitely have FOMO over not ordering the pozole, shrimp toast or Dutch baby with fried haloumi cheese. The Beard & the Boss also had some delicious-looking sandwiches, burritos and bowls, featuring house made sausage that definitely seem worth another trip.

A huge thank you to those of you who told me they tried and enjoyed the places I recommended. After all, is there anything a law student loves more than being right? 😊

SPORT REPORT:



Good Morning Irish Nation,

Well, that certainly wasn't the result we were hoping for. However, we did learn a lot about our team. First, our defense is the real deal. If you had told me we would hold Ohio State, the team with arguably the best offense in the country, to 21 points, I would take that in a heartbeat. Yet, our defense's bend don't break approach got worn down towards the end of the 3rd quarter, resulting in multiple big plays, including a 24 yard passing touchdown on 3rd and 11 for OSU.

Offensively, we have some work to do. Buchner and the Irish showed flashes of potential, but 10 points will almost never win you a football game (unless you're playing Iowa). We would typically start each drive with a disappointing run (or two) and then try to make up for it with a pass. Although Buchner started 8/8 passing, he finished the day 10/18 for only 177 yards. Our run game didn't fair much better finishing with 76 total yards on the day. There is a potential to this offense, as they showed with the occasional big play, but they must be more consistent to string together a real drive. Look for the Irish to take out all their frustrations next week at home against Marshall in what will likely be a blowout win

for the Irish.

Around the rest of the college football world, most games went as expected. Oregon got stomped into the ground by Georgia, and Bama was Bama. There were some thrillers like UNC v. App St. or Houston v. UTSA, but not many games impacting the top 25. The one real upset of the weekend was Mia Oyama's Florida Gators taking down #7 Utah 29-26.

And for those football fanatics who can't wait until next Saturday for more action, don't worry. NFL football returns this week. Will the Bill's finally win the Super Bowl? With the Chiefs make a 5th straight AFC Championship game? Can the Cowboys finally make it past the divisional round? No one knows, but it all starts on Thursday with the Buffalo Bills opening up the season against the reigning Super Bowl champs LA Rams.

Around the rest of Irish Nation, women's soccer moved to 5-0 to stay undefeated after destroying Illinois 4-0 and Wisconsin 4-1. Men's Soccer bounced back with a win 3-2 against Michigan State to move to 1-1 on the season. Lastly, Women's Volleyball continued to struggle moving to 1-4 on the season after dropping two matches to Boise State and Long Beach State.

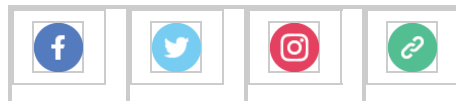
