



Saint of the Week: St. Elizabeth Ann Seton with Professor Nicole Garnett



I have special devotion to the first American saint, Elizabeth Ann Seton. I chose her as my confirmation saint when I entered the Catholic church at 26, and we named our daughter Libby after her. I'm moved by the story of this remarkable woman who was, like me, a wife, mother, convert, and devoted to Catholic education. Born in 1774 to a wealthy New York family, she married young and had five children. (I have a picture of her holding her oldest in my office.) But her husband contracted tuberculosis, leading them to travel to Italy for its warmer climate, where he died. In Italy, she was drawn to the Catholic faith, and she converted to Catholicism upon her return to the U.S. Her family then rejected her, literally throwing her out on the street. Desperate to support her children, she accepted an invitation to move to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where, in 1809, she founded a Catholic school, planting the seeds of U.S. Catholic K-12 education and established the Sisters of Charity, a religious order dedicated to the education and care of the poor. At Emmitsburg, she also met a seminarian, John Hughes, who became the first Archbishop of New York and invited her community to educate the city's impoverished Irish immigrant population. The remainder of Mother Seton's life was dedicated to building her community; six separate religious congregations

trace their roots to her efforts. She died of tuberculosis at 46, having outlived all but two of her children. On her deathbed, she admonished those gathered to "be children of the Church." She was canonized in 1975. (Fun fact: Our oldest daughter, Sister Abigail Margaret (or Maggie) recently entered the Sisters of Life, which has a convent next to the house (now a shrine) where Elizabeth Seton lived with her husband and children!)

Student Refrigerators Have Moved!

The refrigerators for student use in the basement of Eck Hall have moved. There are 2 large refrigerators and 1 large freezer that are available for students to store lunches or other food and drink. Those appliances have been moved from the room across from the SBA Store to down the hall into the vending alcove between the student mailboxes. The previous space used to store the refrigerators has been converted into an office for Student Services Coordinator Ann Kiley (students are welcome to stop by and say hi!).
