#### **Crossings Extended Hours**

#### **Expansion of Reserved Parking Program**

Based on feedback from the campus community, the University has decided to expand the reserved parking options for the 2015-16 year. A limited number of reserved parking spaces will be available in five campus parking lots and all regular faculty and staff are eligible to request a reserved parking permit in one of these lots. A reserved parking permit will provide access to a specific parking space reserved for an individual's sole use Monday through Friday from 7am to 6pm. Reserved parking spaces in each lot will be assigned subject to availability. BK1 – Gated section of Bookstore Lot and Stayer Center – South of Stayer Center are included in the program.
