



The Law Library has added two new ProQuest databases to our electronic resource collection: ProQuest Trends & Policy: U.S. Environment and ProQuest Trends & Policy: U.S. Immigration. Both databases provide access to a variety of materials and resources including statistics and data, news articles, public laws, executive orders, and government reports. Subject topics for U.S. Environment include, among many others, the Clean Water Act, climate change, environmental justice, and international environmental governance. U.S. Immigration topics include border security, deferred action for childhood arrivals, deportation and detention, country information, guest workers, and public health. # Saint of the Week: Bl. Basil Moreau with Fr. Matt Kuczora

Seeing the world around him suffering from war, poverty, and disease, Blessed Basil Moreau formed a new religious community of priests and brothers to be "men with hope to bring" and "educators in the faith" serving in parishes, mission, and especially education.

Born in 1799 to a humble family, Basil Moreau felt a call to serve God and neighbor as a priest. He was a beloved preacher and a popular professor. Recognizing the needs around him, he organized a group of priests giving revival missions at local parishes. He also took charge of a group of talented teachers who felt called to live together in community and devote themselves to God through vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. These were religious "brothers," men who found their teaching to be their primary ministry, while Moreau's priests felt a call to sacramental ministry as well as other ways of serving. Together, the Congregation of Holy Cross was born.

Blessed Basil Moreau had the competence to see the needs around him and the courage to take action to address them. He knew great suffering, but equally knew that God can take our suffering and transform it into new life, just like the suffering of Calvary to the Resurrection. Even in the Cross, there is hope.

From the example of his own humility, prayer, and simple way of life, today Holy Cross

serves in 17 countries with 1,200 members. Our own law school is one of these ministries with Holy Cross priests and brothers ministering in the chapel and the classroom.

When we see suffering and injustice in our world, formed and strengthened by Blessed Basil Moreau's example and benefiting from his firm foundation, may we too be men and women with hope to bring, seeing the Cross of Christ as our only hope, the great hope in the joy of Easter that follows Good Friday, in the love that overcomes all hurt and sin.
