THE NOTRE DAME LAW SCHOOL

The Notre Dame Law School is the oldest Roman Catholic law school in the United States, celebrating its 145th year of continuous operation in 2014. Its national program is designed to equip a student to practice law in every state and in several foreign nations. The school is committed to exploring the moral and religious questions raised in legal studies. The Notre Dame program aims to educate men and women to become lawyers of extraordinary professional competence who possess a partisanship for justice, an ability to respond to human need, and a compassion for their clients and colleagues. The learning program is geared to skill and service. Thus, the school is committed to small classes, especially in the second and third years: emphasis is placed on participation at every meeting of every class.

In order to achieve the goal of producing lawyers who are both competent and compassionate, the entering class is limited to a relatively small size. The Admissions Committee makes its decision based on the "whole person" concept. The Committee considers a broad array of factors in addition to the essential factors of LSAT and GPA, with a view toward assembling a diverse class. Graduates of an approved college or university are considered for admission, and beginning students are admitted only in the fall semester. Applications should be filed before March 1.

Admissions to advanced standing is available to applicants who have completed at least one year of work in another law school; those applicants are admitted to the second year of the curriculum with credit for not more than one year if they meet certain standards. It is also possible for special students to arrange programs which fill their needs but do not lead to a law degree.

Notre Dame Law School offers study abroad for credit on a summer, semester, and year-round basis. Instruction is given in Notre Dame's London Law Center under both American and English teachers.
