CONTRIBUTORS TO THE NOVEMBER ISSUE

His Eminence, Patrick Cardinal Hayes, A. B., Manhattan College, 1888, A. M., 1894; S. T. L., Catholic University in Washington, D. C., 1894. Received his Doctorate of Divinity in Rome, 1902. Ordained to the Priesthood in 1892. Appointed Chancellor of New York in 1903. President of Cathedral College for eleven years. Made Domestic Prelate to the Pope in 1907. Consecrated Auxiliary Bishop of the New York Diocese in 1914. Created Archbishop of New York in 1919. Elevated to the rank of Cardinal in 1924.

Rev. Charles L. O'Donnell, C. S. C., A. B., University of Notre Dame, 1906; studied theology, Holy Cross College, Washington, 1906-1910; Ph. D., Catholic University of America, 1910; Ordained priest, in the Congregation of Holy Cross, June 24, 1910; professor of English Literature, University of Notre Dame, 1910-1920; elected President, 1928; Associate Editor *Ave Maria*. Chaplain, A. E. F., February, 1918-May, 1919. Elected Provincial of Congregation of Holy Cross in United States, August, 1920, and Assistant-Superior General, 1926. Author: *Newman's Gentleman*, 1916; *The Dead Musician and Other Poems*, 1916; *Cloister and Other Poems*, 1922; *A Rime of the Rood and Other Poems*, 1928. Editor, *Notre Dame Verse*, 1917.

Gilbert Keith Chesterton, LL. D., University of Edinburgh; Lit. D., University of Ireland; LL. D., University of Notre Dame. Author of *The Wild Knight; Twelve Types, Heretics, Orthodoxy; The Napoleon of Notting-hill; Studies of Browning and of Dickens* in the "English Men of Letters" series. Contributor to the Daily News and Speaker. Editor and owner of "G. K's. Weekly." Member of the British Academy. Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature.

Hon. Thomas F. Konop, LL. B., 1904, University of Nebraska. Member of the State Industrial Commission of Wisconsin, 1917-22. Member of State Board of Vocational Education, 1917-22. Member of the United States House of Representatives, 1911-17, from Ninth Wisconsin District. Dean of the College of Law, University of Notre Dame.

Aaron H. Huguenard, LL. B., 1922, University of Notre Dame. Professor of Law, University of Notre Dame.
