Justice Dumisa Ntsebeza of South Africa visits Notre Dame Law School

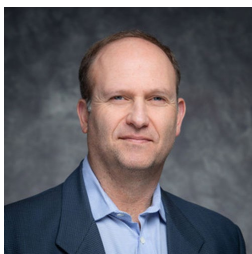

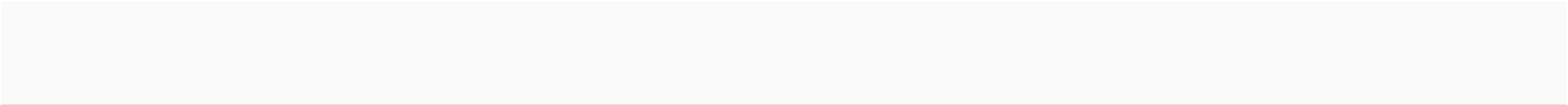
