Professor Richard Garnett receives Pope Pius XI Award from Society of Catholic Social Scientists

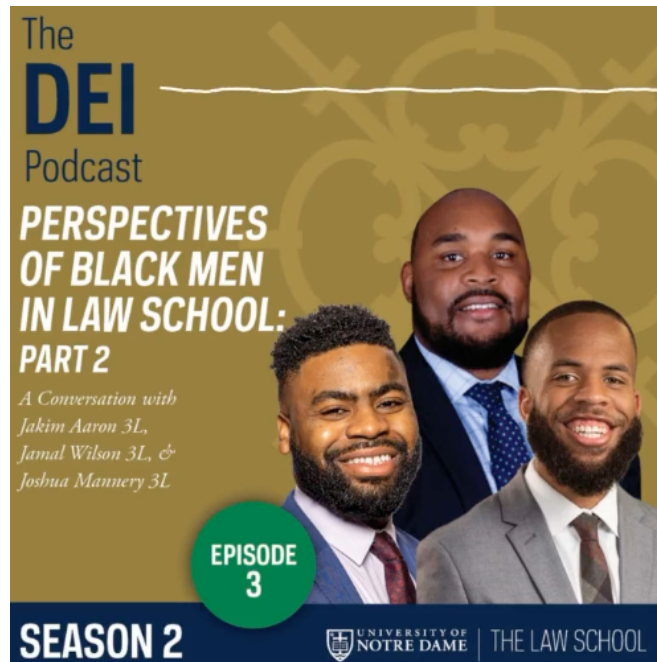

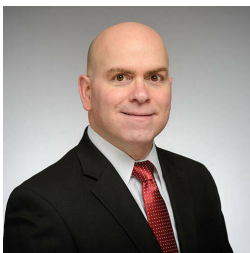
Law School Launches Experiential Learning Program to Serve Parents of Children with Disabilities

Julian Velasco was quoted in the Indiana Lawyer in, “Connecting through community: First-generation programs help law students feel like they belong.” Read more [here](#).

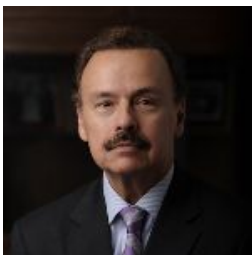
Derek Muller was quoted by the Associated Press in an article about two states’ lawsuits that seek to use the U.S. Constitution’s “insurrection” clause to

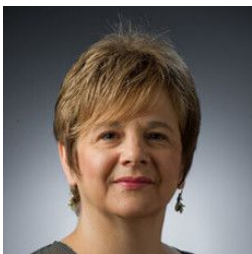

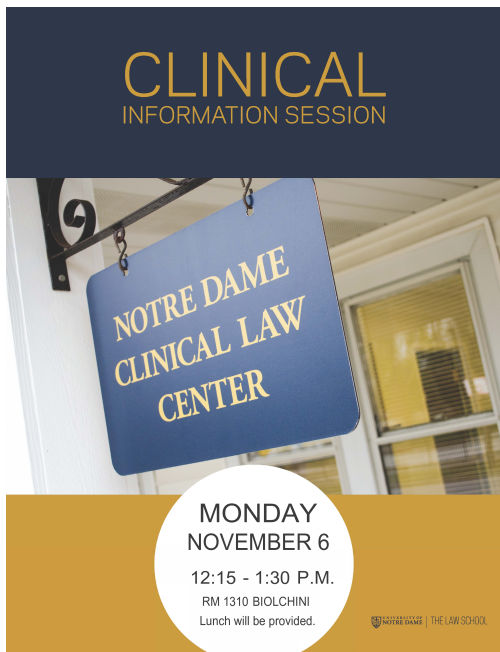

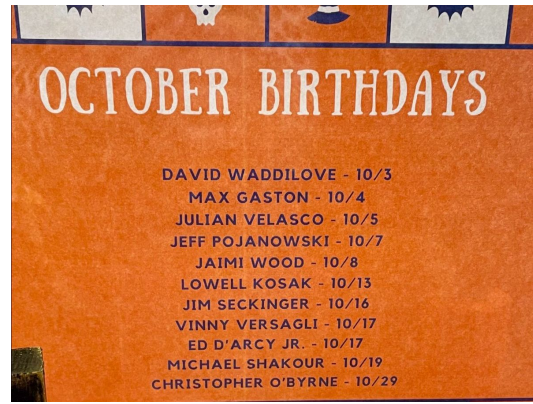


Happy October Birthdays
