Dr. Fatou Bensouda, former ICC Prosecutor and current Gambian High Commissioner to the UK, delivered the annual Peace Through Law Lecture last month at Notre Dame London. She shared insights from her time at the ICC into the vital and complex relationship between peace and justice. "The olive branch of peace is barren without the trunk of blind justice," said Bensouda.

The Peace Through Law Lecture, generously sponsored by the Thomas F. Fay Peace Through Law Endowment for Excellence, is held annually in London and explores the attainment of peace through the successful implementation of justice and the rule of law. **Jimmy Gurulé** oversees the lecture series and moderated the talk.
