Supreme Court patent case has major implications for international relations

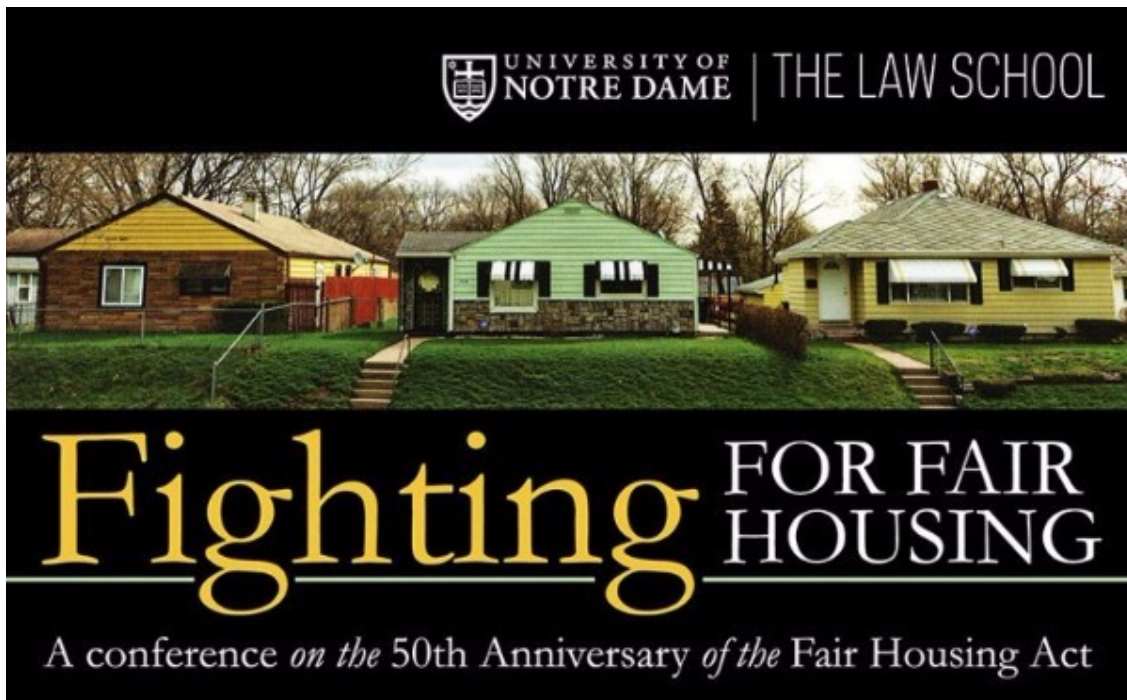
